## Sources of income

First degree candidates and PGCE students can apply for funding from the Student Loans Company through their LEA. Students who are publically funded are not liable for a college fee as this is paid to the college on their behalf with public funding. These students should also be able to apply for a maintenance loan to support them during their studies. In addition the University offers a number of grants and bursaries to support students in their studies.

## Accommodation and lodging for single students

The majority of our PGCE and General students live in the main House in single study bedrooms, some of which are en-suite. All bedrooms have a washbasin unit and ethernet connection (there is a charge of £25 per year for this).

Termly battels (charges to the student from the college for accommodation etc) are comprised of two elements, bedroom rent and catering charge. The catering charge of £130 entitles the student to continental breakfast Monday – Friday, brunch on Saturday and cooked breakfast Sunday during the main ten week term.
